

Gun Violence in the United States

In one year on average in America:

- 42,654 people die from gun violence
- 16,651 are murdered
- 24,569 are suicides
 - 513 are killed unintentionally
 - 552 are killed by legal intervention
 - 310 are killed by undetermined intent, and
- 74,691 people survive gun injuries.

In one year on average, of children and teens (ages 0-17): 7,957 children and teens are shot, 2,029 of them fatally.

Data were compiled by the Brady Campaign using CDC data from 2017-2021.

Gun Violence in Colorado

In 2022, there were 1033 people killed with guns in Colorado.

- 304 were homicides (73% of homicides were with a firearm)
- 690 were suicides (54% of suicides were by firearm)
- 10 were unintentional
- 6 were undetermined
- 23 were legal intervention

67% of gun deaths in 2022 were suicides

Suicides are more prevalent for middle-aged to older white men and in rural areas. This is slightly down from 2021.

In 2022, there were 396,603 background checks for gun purchases. Approximately 1.7% were denied. 60% of the background checks were for handguns.

There are an estimated 307,000 individuals in Colorado with Concealed Carry Permits.
